## To My Fellow Parishioners

The enclosed financial statements present the results from on-going operations and our Capital Fund Drive for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2002. We continue to raise sufficient receipts to cover expenses, although not by a huge margin.

The Operating Reserve of \$137,696 shown on the Statement of Financial Operations largely represents the proceeds of two bequests received during the past year (a revenue source which is too unpredictable to be reliably budgeted). These funds have been reserved for specific projects, including the renovation of the School Music Room and the upgrading of HVAC units in the Parish Activities Center and the School. It is our practice not to expend funds until they have been received; while the bequests were received in the fiscal year just ended, the expenditures will not occur until fiscal year 2002-03.

A statement of your Sunday and Other Contributions for the first seven months of calendar year 2002 is also enclosed with this report. Please take a moment to review it for accuracy. While we do our best to produce accurate statements, we recognize that errors do occur.
