# UPDATE ON OUR PARISH MINISTRY CENTER PROGRESS

#### We are moving ahead!

As we celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost on May 20, we also blessed the site of our new Parish Ministry Center on the west side of the church. While we are still working on our pledge goal of \$8 million, the blessing allowed us to confirm that our plans are moving ahead. So far, more than 700 families out of our 2,800 registered families have pledged. I am so grateful to all who have given so far, and I continue to encourage all others to consider a gift.

The project to build our new Ministry Center is a necessary one if we are to meet our growing needs for the years ahead, and I am sure that with encouragement, many more can make a pledge. Making a pledge is also a great way to honor the memory of a loved one who has passed or indeed a living family member or friend.

As a registered member of our community, I hope that you will see the value of our plans and help us to bring them to completion.

We are currently working on the initial stages of design of our new Ministry Center.

You may have seen some of the site survey workers around the west side of the church recently. Results from that survey will allow us to reopen talks with the City of

Ann Arbor to begin design and construction negotiations.

- Our talented building committee, along with and Hobbs and Black Architects, will continue to work on the program model for our new building throughout the summer. The program model will define what should go into each space in the building and how that space should be utilized.
- By September, our building committee will invite all parishioners to town hallstyle meetings to review the program model and provide feedback. Your feedback will be vital at this stage.
- After the program model is finalized, we will send it to our architect to begin schematic design this fall. Schematic design should last

around 12-18 months, and we should be ready to bid on a general contractor as early as 2020. Stay tuned to future announcements and bulletin articles for further design and construction updates.

With all of us working together, we can do this! Remember, no gift is too small; after all, it is a multi-year pledge campaign, which I know makes it easier for all of us.





# Summer Appeal: Helping provide tuition assistance

Summertime is here and the hallways at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School are still. This is the season when our students can rest and play. Although our school stands empty, preparations are underway for the new year. Over 430 St. Francis school children will return soon, and they'll be ready to learn and have their souls nourished through God's word.

Many of our students and families rely on financial support from either our Tuition Assistance Fund, or our Hopes and Dreams Fund, to facilitate their enrollment at our school. Both programs keep our school accessible, affordable, and available to all.

Here is some information to consider — in the 2017/2018 school year, 40 students, representing 24 families, received \$87,931 in total financial assistance (with aid awarded from either our Tuition Assistance Fund or our Hopes and Dreams Fund). This year we are currently processing requests for nearly 50 students representing 28 families, with anticipated awards of

approximately \$93,500 in total financial assistance. That is only possible through the generosity of our faith community.

**Our 2018 Summer Appeal is on behalf of our Tuition Assistance Fund.** It supports students who have been in our school prior to the establishment of our Hopes and Dreams Fund. These children still need our care. We encourage the Parish to provide assistance to these boys and girls with a tax-deductible donation. 



#### STEPHEN MINISTERS: THE AFTER PEOPLE

Frequently friends will ask, "I know you're involved in Stephen Ministry. Can you tell me exactly what a Stephen Minister is?" I like to explain that Stephen Ministers are "After People."

Stephen Ministers are there: ... after you've washed and returned the last casserole dish. ... after the relationship has ended but the wounds are still bleeding and painful.

... after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away -

and the house suddenly seems incredibly empty.

... after the doctors have said, "There's nothing more that we can do."

### RCIA: IS IT YOUR TIME?

The Acts of the Apostles recounts the descent of the Holy Spirit wherein the apostles heard "a noise like a strong driving wind" and then "there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them (Acts 2:2-3). A crowd gathered at these sights and sounds, and the Jews "from every nation under heaven" heard each apostle speaking "in his own language" (Acts 2:5-6). Peter, the rock upon which Christ built his Church, testified to the risen Christ. And "about 3,000 persons were added that day.

If only all conversions could be that easy. If only we could all witness the birth of Christ's Church and hear the first pope, Peter, testify to the divinity of Jesus and His saving power.

God speaks to us in so many languages: nature, scripture, other people. Often the most quiet voice of God is heard in the quiet of our hearts. The passing thought, the persistent call to do something, the realization we have been putting something off for a while--this too is the voice of God. Perhaps you have been thinking about becoming Catholic for a time. Perhaps you have come to want to be confirmed.

The RCIA process, designed by the Church for adults, helps people to answer God's call to explore discipleship in the


# **'IGNORANCE OF SCRIPTURE IS IGNORANCE OF CHRIST'**
