## Is God calling you: what is discernment?

- •As a savior who is ready and willing to help me out of those jams I find myself
- As a scorekeeper, counting sins along with favors?
- •As an all loving infinite power that eternally watches over me?
- •As a partner who wishes to help all of us, as we help God, create a better world?

Once you take a really deep and honest look at how you see God, a silent conversation begins within your soul. I found myself studying a sunset and suddenly feeling essential to God's plan. Phrases jumped out during the Liturgy of the Word, and suddenly I understood something brand new about an oftenheard Bible verse.

Once these things began to happen, I realized what God was whispering in my ear God wanted me to be a full partner in all that He was creating around me: at my home, our church, our community, and the world. (Of course the very next thing I realized is that God wants all of us to join in this partnership. Everyone's help is needed to create the vision.)
