

HONORING OUR PATRON: Transitus of Saint Francis of Assisi



October 3, 2007: the eve of Feast of St. Francis of Assisi In the dimmed chapel, we began by singing the Prayer of St. Francis as Fr. John entered with a single candle to represent the life of Francis. As each reader came forward to tell a portion of the story of the end of Francis' life, they carried a candle. These five candles signified the stigmata that Francis received. Fr. John proclaimed the same gospel passage that Francis had read to his followers. Cantor Patti Karr led Psalm 142 which was also something that Francis prayed as he died. We closed with the Canticle of the Creatures composed by Francis in 1225.

PRAYER - What Is It and How Do We Do It Well?

For his debut Adult Faith Formation presentation, Fr. John gave a talk on prayer. Attendees learned that in its simplest definition, prayer is conversation with God. It must be learned just as we learn all of our communication skills, and we become adept by continuing to practice!

How do we pray?

Adoration – We acknowledge we are creatures of God and we offer our praise.

Contrition – "O God, be merciful to me a sinner"

Thanksgiving – What are you grateful to God for?

Petition – Jesus himself told us to ask for what we need.

There are many different methods of prayer so if you are uncomfortable with one type, try another. Pray without ceasing!



arish helps Friends In Deed **Respond to Need for Reliable Transportation**

On August 4, St. Francis Parish helped Friends in Deed (FID) offer



Walt Hayes of Select Auto teaches at the car care clinic

a Car Care Clinic by hosting the class in the St. Francis parking lot. The goal of the class was to help save money in costly repairs by teaching preventive maintenance and tips on how to spot trouble before it becomes a major problem. Attendees learned car care basics, gained familiarity with their car's engine compartment and dashboard lights, and got tips on monitoring fluids and tires and selecting service persons and facilities.

Our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society works together with Friends In Deed to get donations of cars in good condition. Currently 15 households are waiting for a donated vehicle. In 2006, 87 requests for transportation-related needs were processed. During the first six months of 2007, 63 requests were processed by FID. Financial hardship means growing numbers of requests for help in getting and maintaining vehicles. Requests include car repair, fuel, car insurance or payment, and car donation. Many in poverty cite the lack of reliable transportation as the foremost barrier to finding or keeping a job.


most vulnerable members of our community will have safe havens and new starts in life.

During the month of November, we remembered all of our departed brothers and sisters by inscribing their names in the Book of Eternal Life. All enrolled




were remembered at all the masses for the entire month.

Memorial Garden Has New Art Work!



I am pleased to "introduce" to you our new Good Shepherd statue. This statue of Christ can be found in our St. Francis Memorial Garden. The bronze art work, the creation of Ginger Hadd of our parish, is the gift of one of our fellow parishioners who wishes to remain anonymous.

A brief blessing ceremony for our new statue was held on Sunday, September 16th at the end of the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

It has come to my attention that many of you are not aware that we have a Memorial Garden. It is located to the immediate west of the church – next to the lower chapel/nursery entrance. Actually the garden has existed since the late 80s and several hundred

people are buried there. The Memorial Garden was created to inter the cremated remains (cremains) of our beloved faithful departed. Unlike a columbarium, in the St. Francis Memorial Garden, the cremains are buried directly into the soil without a container or urn. The name of each person interred in the garden is inscribed on the granite walls of the garden.

Our Memorial Garden is open to any parishioner of St. Francis. The one-time cost is \$400.00 per person. This covers the inscription of the name on the granite walls, the interment and the perpetual upkeep of the garden.

Stop by sometime and see the beautiful new statue of Christ the Good Shepherd and the lovely Memorial Garden. If you think you might wish to have your burial at the garden, please call the parish office.
