

through the "Hire a Pilgrim" project.





On May 13th, the Ya²acht Club wrapped up **Theology on Tap** for the 2007-2008 year. It was a great year with topics ranging from:






St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School The Arts are Alive at St. Francis




ebuilding Together (Christmas in April) THANK YOU!!!

Stephen Ministers provide confidential one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a difficult time. Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their care receiver for around an hour to listen, care, encourage, pray, and provide emotional and spiritual support for the person. Caring relationships last for as long as the person's need persists.

There are five different types of "Needs for Care": · Crisis Care: (new immediate issue); Follow-Up Care: (after shocks, continued

recovery); · Chronic Care: (terminal, never ends); · Preventive Care: (prior to anticipated event); · Supportive Care: (for a friend caring for a loved one).

Four new Stephen Ministers and two new Stephen Leaders were commissioned in June to serve as good listeners and companions on the journey for parish members who ask. New Stephen Ministers are: **Denise Fisher, Neil Galbraith, Melinda Niemann, and John Shaheen.** New Stephen Leaders are: Bob Ferris and Karen Shellie. These 4 new Stephen Ministers have been through 50 hours of specialized training in Christian care giving and join a team of 16 Stephen Ministers at St. Francis Parish.

The training process involves the organization work of our Stephen Leaders, who facilitate the series of courses from January to June each year.

t. Francis Tax Assistance Program

It is such an incredible honor to work with, and to serve such an important need in our community. This year we saw many different types of people come through our site seeking assistance. We saw young newlyweds, retirees, students, single people and new parents. We saw people who continue to do well in their chosen path of life (for example - Joe our young musician whose got a great new CD out and is now doing so well that we had to counsel him out of our program!) while others struggle as a result of the economy. We also met people who have been undergoing some tremendous challenges due to physical and emotional disabilities. Every one of these people was met with kindness and compassion. Our clients are very appreciative of your work.

During the 10 weeks of the program, we saw over 60 clients and helped return well over \$50,000 (net) in tax refunds to our community. In addition, as a result of your efforts, many of these people will also receive tax stimulus payments from the federal government because we assisted them in filing their tax returns this year. This could add upwards of \$10,000 in additional refunds to our



community. These do not seem like large amounts but many of our clients are low-income or have fixed incomes and many times the tax refunds, which include the earned income credit and property tax credit, can be more than 10% of their annual household income. Both the tax refunds and stimulus payments will hopefully have a ripple effect through the community, therefore making our program important to all who are served by it.

Proceeds from this annual benefit contribute to the principal of the Educational Trust Fund, which St. Francis of Assisi Parish established in 1987 to help ensure the future of Catholic education at St. Francis School. As of April 30, 2008 the Fund's balance totaled \$1,155,009. The principal is invested to generate interest, and each year a percentage of the interest is deposited in the school's operating budget to assist with a variety of needs. In the 2008-2009 school year, the award will total \$48,000.
