MARRIAGE IN THE LORD

Convalidation Workshop October 23-24

Perhaps you and your spouse were married civilly, or at another
Christian church, and now as a couple you feel called "to get things right" with the Catholic Church? Perhaps now is the time you wish to have your marriage blessed by the Church?

Our program will prepare you to celebrate what the Catholic Church

calls "convalidation." The program begins Friday evening, October 23, and continues Saturday, October 24, with your convalidation taking place at the end of the Saturday session or during the evening Mass.

In order to register for this program, you should be a couple that:

- Has been married civilly for 10 years or longer
- Has no impediments to
 Convalidation (such as previous un-annulled unions)
- Has been a registered and practicing member of our parish for at least 6 months

(734) 821-2125. Marty will contact you directly about what documents we require. Each couple will need to complete a FOCCUS Inventory online prior to the workshop. There is a \$200 cost associated with this program which covers the materials, food, speakers, etc., but some scholarship funds are available.

This included initial planning for a new welcome center as part of our Church Gathering Space.


This renewed focus on welcome and faith sharing is a key component of our parish's new five-year pastoral plan which we published this past summer. In creating the new plan, our pastoral team and parish leaders worked together to extend the spirit of unity and collaboration across the various ministries thereby creating a more vibrant parish and a welcoming spiritual home for all.

Other highlights from the past year included

- Our Women's Faith and Fellowship Group celebrated its second year by hosting seven
 events with dynamic topics and speakers. Our parish health ministry team hosted a
 successful Women's Health Expo with the support of many businesses and individuals.
- Our biennial Common Conference was held in January and attracted over 350 participants who took part in a wide variety of workshops and talks on evangelization and faith development, including one by our keynote speaker, Deacon Ralph Poyo.
- Once again our liturgical/sacramental life took center stage as our pastoral team and
 parish committees sought ways to enhance our celebration of liturgy and increase active
 participation among our parishioners. New and increased opportunities were provided
 for all our music ministries by adding to our choirs and music groups and offering them
 greater training and faith formation. In addition our worship team created new worship
 aids for special liturgies and to help visitors and children feel more comfortable participating during Mass.
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Once again, the list of outreach and Social Ministry projects could fill several pages. This past year, hundreds of generous parishioners provided assistance in many ways. This included jail ministry, tax preparation, supplying local and Detroit-area food pantries, growing vegetables for at-risk children, and organizing the distribution of thousands of Christmas gifts through our annual Advent Giving Tree.

Working ahead of the Pope's recent call for environmental care, our Sustainability Committee continued to review ways for the parish to be more energy efficient and to promote recycling, waste reduction and the elimination of disposable plates and utensils whenever possible. Once again, the parish hosted an electronic waste recycling day, collecting more than 11,000 pounds of waste.

The Social Ministry team also:

- Raised funds and awareness for causes and groups such as Mercy House, Arbor Vitae, a dormitory project for children in Kenya, Schola Artium in Ypsilanti, and the Rice Bowl collection for Catholic Relief Services during Lent.
- We supported other community ministries, such as Alpha House, Foundations Preschool (formerly Perry School) and St. Vincent de Paul. Plus, we partnered with Habitat for Humanity to complete the Catholic Habitat House, which included a sponsorship of \$10,000.
- We assisted in the Jail Ministry and supported the 57 jail ministers with two retreats and social events.

Sharing in Catholic Education and Formation

St. Francis of Assisi Parish School:

Last year saw continued growth in our parish school enrollment. In response to its mandate, the school continued to strive for the spiritual growth of its students and their academic excellence. We continue to invite all to consider our parish school for their children or grandchildren, and of course offer a variety of financial assistance to help achieve this goal.

Our teachers and staff exceeded the goals of the parish's previous five-year plan, increasing rankings in math and expanding Spanish to grades K-8. The staff continued to review best-practice education programs in the area, working to boost curriculum in science, math and language arts. Students also learned advanced computer programming and

technology information, and had access to better digital research and database resources. With a focus on service and virtue-based learning, the students helped with many service projects, including shopping together and wrapping gifts for the Advent Giving Tree, as well as supporting the CRS Rice Bowl collection in Lent. Sixth-graders visited an area nursing home monthly to play games and interact with the seniors.

Religious Education:

Public school students also have the opportunity to learn and grow in faith through a range of Religious Ed. programs. This year our high school students began to help lead small groups and activities at the Confirmation Retreats for our 8th-graders held at Bethany House in DeWitt.

Adult Formation:

Our parish provides a wide variety of year-round opportunities for education and growth. New initiatives included several on-site and on-line classes. Other learning opportunities included the School of Discipleship, which offered two courses this past year, one on Salvation History and one on Prayer.



Sharing in Friendship

Our small groups continue to grow, helping people of all ages make new friends and hear how God is working in our lives. This year, groups met weekly during Advent and Lent, with members especially enjoying the book *The Lessons of Saint Francis*, a part of our October-long celebrations of our patron. Our celebrations also included "An Evening in Assisi," an Italian dinner and dramatization of the stories of St. Francis by Mark Price.

Friends gathered at a variety of events, including our annual Parish Picnic, senior luncheons, the Women's Faith and Fellowship Group tea, and many events for middle school and high school youth. In December, the parish hosted a special evening of prayer with a dinner and movie in honor of the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe .

Father James has introduced day trips \overline{ovisit} churches of historical importance. This year we visited Detroit, Grand Rapids, and Carey & Toledo, Ohio.

Sharing our Support

The Pastoral Team worked to increase the level of outreach and expertise for support groups that assist people with bereavement and other losses, such as divorce and separation. Once again we hosted a community-wide workshop, called "Grieving with Great Hope," attended by 22 people with follow-up sessions and ongoing support.






Sharing our Financial Gifts

Our Stewardship Team continued to develop the parish's financial gifts, and the Development Committee and Educational Trust Fund Board worked to find new strategies to promote our parish school. Building on its academic success, the school created a new Marketing Committee, which met about eight times during the year to help in advising our school principal on how best to promote and grow our parish school.

Financial highlights include:

- Total gross revenue of \$170,776 was raised for school operations. This included \$86,048 raised from the annual Car Raffle, sponsored by Gene Butman Ford, and from the "Ice Bucket Challenge." Our school also secured a grant of \$20,000 to fund an electronic database and e-books for better research solutions for students.
- Total gross revenue for our school's Tuition Assistance Fund was \$44,392. Part of this fund was raised through the successful "Teeing it up for Tuition" golf outing, which raised \$12,125,





• Our school's "Hopes and Dreams Fund," launched two years ago to assist new families with tuition continues to grow. Last year the Fund helped three families to enroll their children at our school and at least five families will be assisted in the coming year. The Fund is built on an eight year dollar-for-dollar challenge gift of \$40,000 per year from an anonymous benefactor. This year's total gross revenue from gifts and pledges to the Hopes and Dreams Fund was \$130,891 (this included two challenge gifts of \$40,000 from our anonymous benefactor in the same fiscal year – one was for gifts raised in 2014 and the other was for our gifts raised in calendar year 2015).

Another Exciting Year At Our Parish School

With increased enrollment we have four new teachers joining our faculty:

Elana Fata will be our 2nd full-time kindergarten teacher. She also teaches our half-day kindergarten students in the same classroom and comes to us as a recent graduate of The University of Michigan.

Kristine Richart is our new 1st grade teacher. She comes to us from The University of Toledo with a wonderful love for early childhood teaching. Having served as a long-term substitute at the end of the last year, she very quickly found her place in our school community.

Natalia Collins will serve as a leadership teacher, a middle school math teacher, and a math interventionist. She is looking

forward to sharing her faith and her rigorous plans for math instruction at St. Francis.

Maria Durham will be our middle school English teacher and one of the 8th grade religion/home room teachers. She has been a teacher for seven years in high school English. She comes to us with a wealth of knowledge and experience to reinforce the excellence at St. Francis School.

St. Francis School is sending its middle school choir to Rome over the New Year holiday. They will be participating in a Papal mass on New Year's Day celebrated by the Holy Father as members of the international choir organization, Pueri Cantores.



MATH AND TECHNOLOGY

We have adopted new math instructional materials from Glencoe Learning called "My Math." We are also restructuring our middle school math so that in the years ahead, most students will take prealgebra in 7th grade and algebra in 8th grade.

In addition to the new math materials, the elementary teachers (K-5) will be implementing more tablet usage in the classroom with the math programs IXL and Accelerated Math. We are also pleased to continue to have programming opportunities for the lower grades through their technology classes and for our middle school students through electives.



In October we will begin our Fall Small Groups. This is a wonderful opportunity to connect with other parishioners while enriching our faith.

We will be reading Pope Francis' latest encyclical *Laudato Si*. "Laudato Si, mi Signore" translates to "Praise be to you, my Lord," a line from St. Francis of Assisi's Canticle of the Sun. Like St. Francis, Pope Francis is deeply concerned about care for God's creation. In his encyclical, he addresses ecological problems in both the natural

environment and the human community, most importantly, care for the poorest and most vulnerable.

Although encyclicals are historically addressed to the bishops of the Catholic Church with added groups such as clergy, religious, and laymen, Pope Francis seeks to address "every person living on this planet." He states, "I would like to enter into dialogue with all people about our common home." We will be reading and discussing the document's 6 chapters, which include:

- What is Happening to Our Common Home
- 2. The Gospel of Creation
- 3. The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis
- 4. Integral Ecology
- 5. Lines of Approach and Action
- 6. Ecological Education and Spirituality



NEW BIBLE STUDY: THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

As we prepare to enter into Year C of the Liturgical Cycle, our newest Bible Study will tackle the Gospel of Luke and explore context, content, theology and challenges to contemporary life.

The study of this Gospel will be offered on Tuesday mornings (10:00

a.m.) and Thursday evenings (7:00 p.m.), twice monthly beginning September 15 and 17 and will end in late April.


