

# THREE SCRUTINIES & ENLIGHTENMENT

The Gospel readings of the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent—those when we celebrate the special RCIA rites called **scrutinies**—take us on a journey as we follow Christ and grow in faith. We journey from sin, blindness, and death to eternal life with Christ.

Before the Samaritan woman met Jesus at the well, she lived a life of sin. Through her chance meeting with Jesus, she recognizes him for what he is, proclaiming in town that she has met a man who told her all that she ever did. She asks, "Can this be the Christ?"

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we encounter a man born blind, sitting alongside the road. He is regarded as a sinner because of his blindness. When Jesus anoints the man's eyes with clay and heals him, not only are the man's eyes opened to see the world around him, his heart is opened to see the power and truth of God, as well.



In the raising of Lazarus four days after his burial, we encounter what many consider to be Jesus' greatest miracle during his life. It is in this final Gospel of the scrutinies that we find the object of our search: the promise of rising into new life with Christ.

We too have died in Baptism, are forgiven of our sins so that our souls may be healed, and rise again in eternal life with Christ. We too, like Lazarus, pass through the darkness of the tomb to emerge new in the resurrection.

#### LENT SMALL GROUPS BEGIN THE WEEK OF SUNDAY, MARCH 5TH

This Lent, we will be reading *My Other Self: Conversation with Christ on Living Your Faith* by Clarence Enzler.

Modeled on the fifteenth-century classic *The Imitation of Christ, My Other Self* explores the meaning of the Christian life. Written in first person, Christ speaks directly to the reader, inviting him or her to a relationship of friendship and discipleship. The reader is lead to deeper examination of the Christian life: detachment, virtue, prayer, avoidance of sin, and the Eucharist. Each chapter is divided in short sections with scripture for reflection and prayer.

Our evening begins with dinner followed by a panel of speakers presenting on the contributions and role of women (and men) in the church with opportunities for dialogue, questions, and conversation.




# SERVE THE LORD; SERVE THE PARISH

## Students Currently in 4th Grade and Up Needed



TAX PROGRAM WITH ENGLISH & SPANISH-SPEAKING TAX AIDES

Each tax season, experienced parishioners volunteer their time to assist individuals in need with their tax returns. We prepare returns with income of \$45,000.00 or less. Call the Parish Office at (734)769-2550 to volunteer, or to make an appointment for assistance.

Our program is run at St. Francis Parish Office on Saturday mornings until April 8. You are required to sign up in advance. Bilingual individuals are encouraged to join. Must be 16 years or older to volunteer as a tax preparer. Training is provided.

Donate your time (9am– 12:30pm) working together on yard work, planting, trimming, raking, window washing, power washing siding and painting indoors at Emmanuel House.



# HARD AT WORK AT ST. FRANCIS SCHOOL

Students are studying hard this time of year. We are in the trenches of the school year learning new material. Our Kindergarteners are learning to write sentences. Our first graders are studying Black History Month and Dental Health Month in their science and social studies. Second graders are mixing up math groups to focus on more individualized instruction. Currently they are excited to learn more about money. Third grade is focusing on their research report. Teachers walk students through how to do research and organize their thoughts into a coherent and informative writing piece. Fourth grade is starting to prepare for their musical. They audition for their roles and learn the songs for their original performance written by our very own Mrs. Maura Dalian. The performance will be a part of our Mary Lou Daby Fine Arts Festival on Thursday, May 18th at 5pm; the performance is at 7pm. Fifth grade is getting ready for Storer Camp this spring and Sixth grade is continuing their service projects to Storypoint Senior Living Center. Seventh and Eighth grade students have finished their collaborative science research projects. Seventh graders begin their physical science unit by studying forces in motion. They will build coaster and propeller cars and test them in the PAC. Eighth grade is preparing for Confirmation and continuing their writing projects they have started throughout the year.

Lent is always a busy time in the school. The teachers work to create a learning and valuable experience for the students each day. Every family receives a Lenten reflection book to pray with at home.

The teachers work to help the children understand the season of Lent through service, learning opportunities, and alms giving. The school will be collecting coins to raise money for Fr. Bosco's parish in India. We will be giving service time in our local community. Lastly, our students spend Holy Thursday participating in Lenten Centers and our middle schoolers participate in an annual Seder Meal.

St. Francis School has been continuing to add wonderful events and programs to our instructional practices. This winter we added an enrichment program for native Spanish speakers. Students will have a lunch group that practices writing, reading, and speaking in their native language of Spanish.
