

# OUR JOURNEY THROUGH ADVENT TO CHRISTMAS

Advent begins on Sunday, Dec. 2, this year. It is a season of waiting and preparation. Just as Mary and Joseph awaited the birth of the Baby Jesus and prepared to welcome Him into the world, so, too, should we. Have you thought about how you might spiritually prepare for

Christmas as you journey through this special season of Advent? Following are a few suggestions.

#### Make a Jesse Tree.

Each "branch" of the Jesse Tree tells a story about the heritage of Jesus through writings from the Old Testament. To create one, please visit our parish website



Advent page at stfrancisa2.com/advent/ and click on the "Jesse Tree" link. This site explains the tradition and gives step-by-step instructions for making a tree of your own.

It is a wonderful activity for families with young children. The ornaments on the tree have a

picture on one side and a correlating scripture verse on the other. Kids will enjoy helping create the tree by coloring the ornaments. Each day, one ornament is hung on the tree while the correlating scripture verse is read aloud.

**Celebrate St. Nicholas Day.** St. Nicholas is the Patron Saint of children, and his feast day is celebrated on Dec. 6. In many European countries, the tradition is for children to leave their shoes on the fireplace hearth or outside their bedroom door on the evening of Dec. 5. When they wake up, their shoes are filled with small religious items or other small gifts or treats.

A Stocking for Jesus. Hang a special stocking for Jesus. Ask your children to do special acts of kindness for others throughout the season of Advent. Write the acts on small pieces of paper, and tuck them into Jesus' stocking. What better gift could our children give to Jesus on Christmas morning?

# THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR

'A light rises in the darkness' (Ps 112)

Each year at St. Francis, we seek to draw all of our Advent and Christmas events and activities together under one unifying theme. This year, in the midst of all that is going on in our world, our eyes came to rest on Psalm 112 and the line "A light rises in the darkness."

As Catholics, that light is Jesus Christ, whose birth we celebrate and whose presence is at the heart of our community of faith. Advent is a special time for Catholics, one that can be lost in what the world sees as "the holidays." It is a specific time of prayer, renewal and sharing as we prepare to celebrate the birth of the Savior at Christmas.

Advent is not Christmas -- that season begins on Christmas Eve and ends on with the Baptism of the Lord, this year celebrated on Jan. 13. That is why we here at St. Francis do not sing carols or decorate our church during Advent, but instead make every effort to stem the ever-encroaching tide of the "holidays" to preserve this holy time and its true purpose.

Each year, I am often asked by folks, "Why no carols or lighted trees?" And each year I answer, "It's not Christmas yet!" Instead, I try to encour-

age all of us to use the Advent season to ponder the light of Christ in our lives, and to seek ways to let that light shine in the lives of others. It is his light that brightens the way of our community and inspires us in all that we do.

As you will see from this edition of the Canticle, we are again offering lots of opportunities for all of us to let his light shine -- in Advent, Christmas and beyond -- opportunities for seasonal prayer, reconciliation, service, sharing. I hope and pray that you will take advantage of these opportunities. As I noted above, our theme seems so appropriate in this time of darkness in our world. We need Christ's hope and the promise of new life to encourage and strengthen our prayer and our endeavors. We need his light to brighten our world.

Once you have finished reading this edition and chosen the activities you wish to be part of, I encourage you to share it with family and friends and invite them to be part of our community of faith. Christ's light is for all!

Thank you to all who have attended the Town Hall meetings in September and October.

We appreciate that city officials attended our Oct. 23 Town Hall along with a few neighbors. Standing with Fr. James (photo, right) is 3rd Ward Councilperson Julie Grand, and our County Commissioner, Jason Morgan.

If you missed the Town Hall meetings, feel free to visit our website to listen to our podcast. If you have any questions or feedback, please feel free to contact the Building Committee via email at **ministrycenter@stfrancisa2. org**.

We are now entering into the next phase of the Ministry Center development, but we still need your help. As of Nov. 1, we are still \$1.3 million away from our pledge goal and we still need your help.

Now is the time to invest in our St. Francis faith community by embarking on a once-in-ageneration improvement to our Parish. We have outgrown the PAC and must alleviate this bottleneck to better serve our various ministries, school, volunteers and community. Simply put, more meeting spaces will allow our



community of faith to better serve God and help those in need both financially and spiritually.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this point. Our building committee and architect, Hobbs + Black, will be working tirelessly throughout 2019 to refine the design of the Ministry Center, and provide periodic updates to our parishioners. Witness to HEPPE The Catholic Diocese of Lansing

We hope to have enough design and approvals in place to begin the bidding process for the general contractor by late 2019, start construction during the summer of 2020 and be completed by Christmas 2021.

As of Sept. 30, 2018, we have received \$809,896.11 in pledge payments for our Parish share of the Witness to Hope Capital Campaign. Pease keep in mind that this actually reflects payments made to Witness to Hope through June 30, 2018.

## **Next Generation Science**

St. Francis of Assisi School has adopted the Next Generation Science Standards as the new K-8 science curriculum. These standards are research-based, written by science education experts, and are a reflection of how students learn most effectively. The NGSS aims to ensure that "all students have some appreciation of the beauty and wonder of science; possess sufficient knowledge of science and engineering to engage in public discussions on related issues; are careful consumers of scientific and technological information related to their everyday lives; are able to continue to learn about science outside school; and have the skills to enter careers of their choice, including (but not limited to) careers in science, engineering, and technology" (*A Framework for K-12 Science Education*). All of this is crucial for young Catholics as they influence our world in their studies, careers, voting, and vocations.

Our parish school is a place of formation where we can raise up young men and women of faith to be speakers of the truth, problem-solvers, critical consumers, stewards of our planet, and people of reason. I am privileged to be part of a school that takes seriously our mandate to be salt and light, and I am grateful for the support of our parish and our parishioners.


## "Preparing for the *Light* of the World In the Darkness of Advent" Sunday, Dec. 2 at 2 p.m.
