Medical Mission San Pedro Sula, Honduras Garbage Dump September 22 – 26, 2010

International Samaritan serves the “least of God’s people” living next to garbage dumps in conditions of extreme poverty

through housing, education, nutrition, child care, counseling and other human services.

International Samaritan is devoted to building communities within the gross poverty of the developing world. International Samaritan’s goal is to foster economic independence for garbage dump dwellers by providing housing, daycare, and education so peace and dignity can be found for those who are willing to work and to dream.

Dental and Medical Missions

During the five-day experience, the Medical Mission Team will serve an estimated 1,000 children, women and men living next to the San Pedro Sula, Honduras garbage dump. Patients will be seen at the new Richard Flascck International Samaritan Medical Clinic. Our staff and translators will be available to assist non Spanish speakers as necessary.



The Dental & Medical Team Will:

- Provide dental and medical attention to students ages 7-17 and their families from the Int. Samaritan school in San Pedro Sula
- Attend to the medical needs of children ages 3 months to 6 years from the Int. Samaritan nursery
- Provide eyeglasses to the local community
- Collaborate with community leaders to provide medical care to poor families living at the garbage dump
- Educate local community members in the prevention of common illnesses
- Work with local doctors to provide follow-up care for patients

- 35% – 45% of the Central American population live in gross poverty and extreme want according to the United Nations.
- According to municipal authorities in San Pedro Sula, 89% of the population of the garbage dump community lives below the poverty line; the average age of a local garbage dump dweller is 49 years, and an average family has 6 children.
- Int. Samaritan sponsors a variety of programs that serve an estimated 7,000 annually in the poorest communities in the developing world.
